

GRAND KNIGHT'S MESSAGE

Happy New Year! I hope everyone is having a happy Christmas Season as well. Please remember that the Christmas Season ends with the Feast of the Baptism of the Lord, which falls on Sunday, January 13 this year.

Thank you to all of our members and their families that have made 2012 a successful year for our council. We won the Star Council from the Supreme Council for our programs and membership growth in the 2011-12 fraternal year. This is the highest award given to councils for such activity. We are on our way to achieving this again with our programs. However, we are lacking the membership growth this year and need some members to get their brother Catholics to join the Order and our council. Please ask a brother Catholic that you know to join us in our work.

Getting the programming is not a problem for us. Soon we will have our annual Friday Lenten Fish Fry's. These allow us to do a lot of work for the parish while holding a community activity for the parish. This month we have our annual Free Throw competition on Saturday, January 12 and we will be holding a Pennies For Heaven collection following Masses over the weekend of January 12-13. At our December business meeting I presented a resolution to the council for consideration. The resolution does not affect our council. This is simply a request to have our council present a request for consideration at the State Convention to be held over Memorial Day weekend at the Kalahari Resort in Sandusky (all are welcome to attend). If approved by the State Convention, this request will be forwarded to the Supreme Council for consideration at the Supreme Convention. The text of this resolution is included on page 5 of this newsletter. It is a request for Supreme Council to hold the council number 16670 to be used by a council choosing to honor St. Maximilian Kolbe in their council name, in recognition of his prisoner number from Auschwitz, by which he is often known.

I am working on the addition of praying the rosary before each council meeting. I do not have a time or location for when and where the rosary will be held, but our meeting will remain at 7:30 PM on the second Monday of the month. I'm thinking about planning a party. It will be a post-apocolypse party and I will have it on Dec. 22. Yes, I say that in jest but all kidding aside, I think it might be a good idea. I'm sure everyone in the world has heard the dire predictions that the end of the Myan calendar, along with Nostradamus predictions have the world ending, or at least undergoing significant, catastrophic change on 12-21-2012. The end-times are always a curiosity in our life and certainly intriguing if nothing else. For Christians, we anticipate a time of turmoil followed by the welcome culmination of life with Christ. My aim is not a discussion about details and events of the second coming so I will leave it at that. With several readings at Mass of late connected with the end-times I know I have heard at least a couple sermons regarding end-times. The crux of the ones I have heard have been consistent. FINANCIAL SECRETARY CORNER

Invoices for 2013 Dues and Culture of Life Assessment should have arrived in your mailboxes by now, along with a form to be completed for the 2012 Annual Fraternal Survey. This form is also included on page 7 of this newsletter along with instructions for its completion.

We now have 190 plus members, and I ask you to be considerate of your Brother Knights, and realize that you can help significantly by paying your dues promptly on the initial billing. Two things you can do to really help are:

First, pay your dues promptly. Preferably in full, but if you can't make the full payment, submit a partial payment. I'm happy to take as little as \$5.00 per month.

Second, please do not leave us guessing in the dark! If you are unable to pay at all, or you wish to Withdraw, please respond and explain the circumstances. When we have the circumstances, we can present them to the Trustees, and we have in the past granted complete waivers or temporary waivers of the dues. However, if we hear nothing from you, we cannot help! As for Withdrawal, please note that I as the Financial Secretary cannot initiate a Withdrawal Request. Withdrawals must be initiated by you via a personal letter to Supreme. If you indicate to me that you wish to withdraw, I will send you a sample letter and stop requesting your dues payment, however, you must submit the letter. If you do not submit the letter, you remain an active member, and will now have dues in arrears, and if not paid, will have to be processed for suspension.

Know that for every active member on our roles, whether you have paid your dues to us or not, we are taxed about \$18.00 by Supreme, the State, and the Greater Columbus Chapter. We want to keep you as Active Members in Good Standing with our Council. This means being paid up fully in your dues and assessments, or communicating with us so that we know your situation and can work with you to keep you in Good Standing.

The 1st, 2nd and 3rd degrees in the Knights of Columbus can be looked upon like three of the first sacraments we all receive as Catholics. In other words, the 1st degree can be looked upon like **Baptism**, the 2nd degree like **First Communion**, and the 3rd degree like **Confirmation**.

From this perspective a 1st degree knight is like a Catholic who has been baptized but hasn't yet received the sacraments of Holy Communion and Confirmation. Would you consider yourself to be a practical Catholic in that situation? **THINK ABOUT THAT IF YOU ARE A FIRST DEGREE KNIGHT**.

RESOLUTION TO HONOR ST. MAXIMILIAN KOLBE (Presented at December Business Meeting)

Last month I presented a resolution to the council for consideration to be voted upon at our January business meeting. The purpose of the resolution is to request the Supreme Council to reserve council number 16670 for a council choosing to honor St. Maximilian Kolbe in their council name. The process is for a council or council to bring a resolution to the State Convention for consideration and, if approved, the State Council will present it for consideration at the Supreme Convention. What follows in the resolution is material about St. Maximilian Kolbe showing justification for giving him a special honor, why the number 16670 is significant to St. Maximilian Kolbe, examples of Supreme Council holding council numbers for other purposes, and the request to have Council Number 16670 forever known as Saint Maximilian Kolbe Council 16670.

HONORING SAINT MAXIMILIAN KOLBE

WHEREAS, in the year 1917, Saint Maximilian Kolbe began the Knights of the Immaculata, whose purpose is "to do all you can for the conversion of sinners, heretics, schismatics,... and for the sanctification of all persons under the sponsorship of the Blessed Virgin Mary, the Immaculate Mediatrix. This work has this aim: to bring within reach of all persons the happiness that comes from the presence of God, the first source of all happiness. It is to be done under the protective care of the Blessed Virgin Mary, Mediatrix"; and

WHEREAS, Saint Maximilian Kolbe provided shelter to thousands of refugees in Poland during World War II, was arrested on February 17, 1941, transferred to Auschwitz on May 28, 1941, and given prisoner number 16670; and

WHEREAS, when ten men were selected at random to be starved to death as punishment for the disappearance of three prisoners at the end of July 1941, Saint Maximilian Kolbe volunteered to take the place of one of the selected men, Franciszek Gajowniczek, who cried out "My wife! My children!", and

WHEREAS, Saint Maximilian Kolbe led the other condemned men in song and prayer and encouraged them by telling them they would soon be with Mary in Heaven; and

WHEREAS, only Saint Maximilian Kolbe survived after two weeks of dehydration and starvation, leading the guards to give Saint Maximilian Kolbe a lethal injection of carbolic acid and he died on August 14, 1941; and

WHEREAS, on October 10, 1982, Saint Maximilian Kolbe was canonized as a martyr by Pope John Paul II with Franciszek Gajowniczek in attendance; and

WHEREAS, council numbers, such as 1000, 5000, 10000, and 15000, were held for special purposes; and

WHEREAS, Saint Maximilian Kolbe is often depicted holding his prison uniform displaying his prisoner number, 16670;

NOW THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED, that council number 16670 be reserved for a council choosing to honor Saint Maximilian Kolbe by naming their council after Saint Maximilian Kolbe; and

FURTHER RESOLVED, that Council 16670 will be forever known as Saint Maximilian Kolbe Council 16670.

The 1st degree, based on **charity**, is the one you have taken. The 2nd and 3rd degrees being offered on the above date at the **Bryce Eck Parish Center of St. Andrew Church, 3880 Reed Road, Upper Arlington** are based on **unity** and **fraternity**. One does not achieve full knighthood in the Knights of Columbus until you have taken the 3rd degree.
