

BACKGROUND ON THE MIRACLE LEAGUE



If we were to tell you about an organized youth baseball league, you might call it *ordinary*. If we were to tell you the athletes are physically and mentally disabled, you might call it *touching*. If you were to see them play, you might call it *a miracle*.

Welcome to the Miracle League of Central Ohio, which was formed in 2004 with the mission of raising funds to build a unique baseball field for children with disabilities in the Central Ohio area. The City of Dublin kindly donated the land required for this field. Opening day was on August 28, 2005 at Darree Field Park on Cosgray Road in Dublin, Ohio. The Miracle League field is the first of its kind in Ohio.

The Miracle League of Central Ohio provides opportunities for people with disabilities to play Miracle League baseball. We sponsor an atmosphere that encourages the entire Central Ohio community to participate and enjoy the Miracle League activities. The Miracle League cannot change or cure the medical issues life has dealt people with disabilities. What we can do is provide them with an opportunity to experience the joy and benefits which come from playing our national pastime - baseball!

The Miracle League Field is fully accessible to all those who are disabled. The custom-designed venue incorporates a cushioned, synthetic surface with base paths, bases, batters' box, pitcher's mound, and home plate painted on the surface. This design eliminates barriers for people who are visually impaired, wheelchair- or walker-restricted, or who use any type of mobile device.

A **Night League** was created in 2005 out of the traditional children's Miracle League to accommodate teenagers and adults that are more able-bodied and may have some baseball experience. Games are played Monday and Thursday evenings under the lights at the Miracle League Field in Dublin.

Typically, players do not utilize buddies in the Night League. Wooden and aluminum bats are used along with soft-core baseballs as opposed to the plastic bats and balls used in the Traditional League games. The players occupy all the positions in the field, but the coaches do the pitching. Games usually last an hour and a half or less with everybody batting and playing the field for three (3) innings. Plays can be made on runners at bases and in the field. The games are filled with fun and lots of sportsmanship. (Photos courtesy of Neil Lauron, Columbus Dispatch. 
ST. TIMOTHY CHURCH AND ST. TIMOTHY COUNCIL #14345 KOFC - 2013 BLUE MASS

St. Timothy Catholic Church, 1088 Thomas Lane, and St. Timothy Knights of Columbus Council No. 14345 will host the 2013 Blue Mass on **Wednesday**, **September 11**, **2013 at 5:00 p.m.** The Blue Mass is an opportunity to honor and pray for all active, retired and deceased law enforcement, fire fighters, and emergency medical personnel. In addition, it is an occasion to remember the 2,973 who lost their lives in the Sept. 11, 2001 terrorist attacks. Bishop Frederick Campbell will be the celebrant and homilist for the Blue Mass.

The Blue Mass dates back to 1934 in Washington DC. The Blue Mass has been a common tradition in the Northeast United States, but it has more recently been extended throughout the country particularly in the wake of September 11th, 2001. The Blue Mass honors and recognizes the sacrifice of police, firefighters, paramedics, emergency medical crews, all members of the public safety community and those who have given their lives in service to their communities. Blue refers to the color of uniforms many public safety employees have traditionally worn.

Among those participating will be Columbus Police Chief Kimberly Jacobs; Columbus Fire Chief Gregory Paxton and Assistant Fire Chief Karry Ellis; Franklin County Sheriff Zach Scott; the Columbus Police Honor Guard; Columbus Police and Fire Pipes and Drums; and the Fourth Degree Knights of Columbus.

All active and retired law enforcement, fire and emergency personnel and their families in the greater Columbus area, members of St. Timothy Church and all parishes in the Diocese of Columbus, and all members of the Knights of Columbus are invited to attend. The Blue Mass is a wonderful way to bring the community together and give spiritual support to those who support us but who are too often unremembered and unrecognized.

NEXT 2ND AND 3RD DEGREE CEREMONIES – BRYCE ECK CENTER, SUNDAY, OCTOBER 27

Sunday, October 27 is the next opportunity to take the 2nd and 3rd degrees in the Knights of Columbus so you can achieve full knighthood in the order. As most of you know, the 4 principles of the Knights of Columbus are *Charity*, *Unity*, *Fraternity*, and *Patriotism*. The four degree ceremonies are each based on one of these principles. The 1st degree, based on *charity*, is the one you have taken. The 2nd and 3rd degrees being offered on the above date at the Bryce Eck Parish Center of St. Andrew Church, 3880 Reed **Road, Upper Arlington** are based on *unity* and *fraternity*. One does not achieve full knighthood in the Knights of Columbus until you have taken the 3rd degree.
