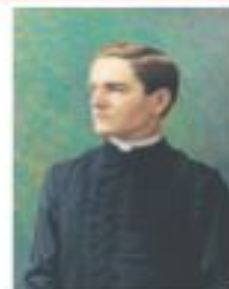

GREATER COLUMBUS RIGHT TO LIFE FUND RAISING DINNER – MONDAY, JUNE 9

Brother Knight Earl Crosby is hosting a table at the Greater Columbus Right to Life Annual Fund raising dinner on Monday June 9 from 6:30 to 8:30 PM at Villa Milano Banquet Center.

This year's theme is "A Night of Life and Love". The featured speaker is Abby Johnson, a former Planned Parent Director, who saw the light and walked away from her job to found "And Then There Were None", an organization dedicated to helping abortion mill workers walk away from their jobs. There is no cost for the dinner, but you will be asked for a tax deductible donation.

Greater Columbus Right to Life education programs include sidewalk counseling in front of Columbus abortion mills. Last year this program influenced more than 75 women to choose life instead of death for their unborn baby. Earl is one of three Knights who serve on the organization's Board of Trustees.

RESOLUTION HONORING ST. MAXIMILIAN KOLBE APPROVED BY SUPREME COUNCIL

St. Michael Council 11445 submitted a resolution last year asking that the Supreme Council honor St. Maximilian Kolbe by reserving council number 16670 to be named after him. The number 16670 was his prisoner number in Auschwitz, where he became a martyr of the Church.

This resolution was submitted to the Ohio State Council for consideration at the 2013 State Convention. The resolution passed review in committee and received approval from the convention for submission to the Supreme convention. From there, the resolution was reviewed at the Supreme office and included in the resolutions to be reviewed at the 2013 Supreme Convention. Again, the resolution passed review in committee, but was recommended for review by the Board of Directors. I recently received news from State Deputy Ken Girt that the resolution was directed to the Supreme Membership Office and that they are asking for the number to be reserved.

Congratulations on putting together a resolution and getting it approved by the Supreme Council. This is a lengthy process and one that most council submitted resolutions do not make it through. It is my understanding that this is the only *council-submitted-resolution* to be approved by the Supreme Council from the 2013 Supreme Convention. Congratulations!

OHIO KOFC 2014 SUPER CASH BONANZA CHARITY CAMPAIGN UPDATE

WELL DONE! We made our initial turn in bonus with 450 tickets exceeding the 311 goal. This adds significantly to our percentage of the ticket sale revenue that we will receive.

As of this writing, we have reached the sale of 540 tickets toward the next level goal of 633. This next level goal means another significant increase in our portion of the ticket sales. Saturday, May 3, 8:00 AM to 4:00 PM, at High Street and 161, is the date, time and location for our council's Measure Up campaign for developmentally disabled programs this year. For those new to the council, we collect money on the street at the corner of High and 161, and distribute rulers explaining what the Measure Up program is all about. Twenty percent of what we collect goes to the state KofC to distribute to programs for developmentally disabled, and we get 80% back to distribute ourselves. FLAG DECORATING AT RESURRECTION CEMETERY – SATURDAY, MAY 24, 1:30 PM

This annual event is scheduled for 1:30 PM, Saturday, May 24, Resurrection Cemetery, Lewis Center, US 23 just north of Delaware/Franklin county line. This work involves teams of 4-5 people making sure that their assigned 50-60 veteran gravesites have flags. We will be placing over 1400 flags. Teams are pre-assigned and as much as possible, experienced people are given the same general areas. Since teams are pre-assigned, please help us stay organized and pre-register to work the event.

In previous years, we've had over 150 people. Battelle staff and St. Michael Council Knights of Columbus had ~90 volunteers and other groups provided the rest. Helpers came from other parishes (St. Peter, St. Joan of Arc, St. Mary Delaware), other KofC councils, Honor Flight volunteers, scouts, and submarine veterans.

Family and friends are more than welcome, and children are encouraged. Since the teams are pre-assigned, please send me your names if you are coming. Event is rain or shine, but lightning or a tornado watch/warning will cancel the event.

Thanks to Cy/Hollis Cottrell and Pat/Kim Rosmarin who will be running the event this year. Please sign up by May 12 (our next business meeting) so that we can assign the teams ahead of time. As you can guess, getting 150 people started with the effort can be difficult without pre-assigning the teams.

If your name is listed above, **Sunday, May 18** is the next opportunity to take the **2nd and 3rd degrees** in the Knights of Columbus so you can achieve full knighthood in the order. As most of you know, the 4 principles of the Knights of Columbus are **Charity, Unity, Fraternity, and Patriotism**. The four degree ceremonies are each based on one of these principles. The 1st degree, based on *charity*, is the one you have taken. The 2nd and 3rd degrees being offered on the above date at the **Bryce Eck Parish Center of St. Andrew Church, 3880 Reed Road, Upper Arlington** are based on *unity* and *fraternity*. One does not achieve full knighthood in the Knights of Columbus until you have taken the 3rd degree. The 4th degree is optional.

To give you some idea of the extent of your time commitment on **May 18**, all 2nd and 3rd degree candidates are expected to meet at the **Key Bank across from St. Michael's at 10:45 AM** from which you will be transported to St. Andrew's Bryce Eck Center, 3880 Reed Road, Upper Arlington, by your brother knights of St. Michael Council. Candidates must be at the Bryce Eck Center by **11:30 AM** for some administrative details. (Bring your **current 1st degree membership card** with you.) The degree ceremonies begin at **12:00 PM**. Each ceremony lasts about 1 hour and 15 minutes with about a half hour break in between. All activities should be over by about 4:00 PM. **Contact me, John Greve, at 614-296-6565 or johnmgreve@gmail.com to let me know if you plan to take these degrees on May 18. (Please respond by Thursday, May 15).**

**A PERSPECTIVE ON THE SIGNIFICANCE OF THE 1ST, 2ND AND 3RD DEGREES
 IN THE KNIGHTS OF COLUMBUS**

The 1st, 2nd and 3rd degrees in the Knights of Columbus can be looked upon like three of the first sacraments we all receive as Catholics. In other words, the 1st degree can be looked upon like **Baptism**, the 2nd degree like **First Communion**, and the 3rd degree like **Confirmation**.

From this perspective a 1st degree knight is like a Catholic who has been baptized but hasn't yet received the sacraments of Holy Communion and Confirmation. Would you consider yourself to be a practical Catholic in that situation? **THINK ABOUT THAT IF YOU ARE A FIRST DEGREE KNIGHT.**
