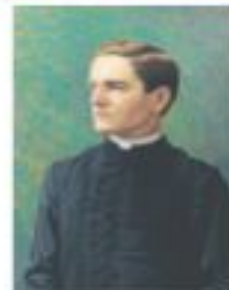

There is no cost for the dinner, but you will be asked for a tax deductible donation.

Greater Columbus Right to Life education programs include sidewalk counseling in front of Columbus abortion mills. Last year this program influenced more than 75 women to choose life instead of death for their unborn baby. Earl is one of three Knights who serve on the organization's Board of Trustees.

**SPECIAL OLYMPICS STATE SUMMER GAMES, JUNE 27-29**

Some 2,700 athletes and coaches are preparing for competition for the Special Olympics Ohio's biggest event of the year – the **State Summer Games** – to be held June 27-29 in Columbus. The Games bring together Special Olympics athletes from across the state for competition in 11 sports: Aquatics, Athletics (track and field), Bocce, Bowling, Cycling, Gymnastics, Power Lifting, Roller Skating, Soccer, Tennis and Volleyball. Most competition venues are on the campus of **The Ohio State University**. The State Summer Games officially kick off June 27 at 7:00 p.m. with the inspiring Opening Ceremonies at the Jesse Owens Memorial Stadium. The ceremony will feature a Parade of Athletes with representative athletes and coaches from throughout Ohio, along with the dramatic entrance of the Torch Run into the stadium and the lighting of the "Flame of Hope." Law Enforcement Torch Run officers will hand off the torch to the athletes, who in turn ignite the Flame of Hope. The lighting of the flame officially signifies the opening of the Games.

## **HONORING OUR BLESSED MOTHER DURING MAY AT ST. MICHAEL SCHOOL**

At St. Michael School the Blessed Virgin Mary is greatly loved! During the month of May there are many ways that the students and teachers of the school express their devotion to her. For a few years there has been an opportunity for students and parents to participate in a Marian consecration according to St. Louis de Montfort on May 13, the Feast of Our Lady of the Blessed Sacrament.
