FINANCIAL SECRETARY CORNER

Annual Assessment time is approaching! Invoices for 2016 Dues and Culture of Life Assessment will begin arriving in your mailboxes in mid December. Along with the Invoice, a form to be completed for the Annual Fraternal Survey will also be included. This form will also be made part of the December Newsletter along with instructions for its completion.

We now have 220 plus members, and I ask you to be considerate of your Brother Knights, and realize that you can help significantly by paying your dues promptly on the initial billing. Two things you can do to really help are:

First, pay your dues promptly. Preferably in full, but if you can't make the full payment, submit a partial payment. I'm happy to take as little as \$5.00 per month.

Second, please do not leave us guessing in the dark! If you are unable to pay at all, or you wish to Withdraw, please respond and explain the circumstances. When we have the circumstances, we can present them to the Trustees, and we have in the past granted complete waivers or temporary waivers of the dues. However, if we hear nothing from you, we cannot help! As for Withdrawal, please note that I as the Financial Secretary cannot initiate a Withdrawal Request. Withdrawals must be initiated by you via a personal letter to Supreme. If you indicate to me that you wish to withdraw, I will send you a sample letter and stop requesting your dues payment, however, you must submit the letter. If you do not submit the letter, you remain an active member, and will now have dues in arrears, and if not paid, will have to be processed for suspension.

Know that for every active member on our roles, whether you have paid your dues to us or not, we are taxed about \$18.00 by Supreme, the State, and the Greater Columbus Chapter.

We want to keep you as Active Members in Good Standing with our Council. This means being paid up fully in your dues and assessments, or communicating with us so that we know your situation and can work with you to keep you in Good Standing.

SIGNS ON THE ROAD (Presented by our lecturer at our October Meeting)

One country morning, a pastor and his parochial vicar are out by a sign in front of their parish. The changeable letters were arranged to read, "Turn back now, the end is near!" As a car approaches they wave to try and get the driver's attention. The driver slows down, reads the sign, then yells at them, "You guys are crazy! Leave me alone you religious nuts!" Then he laughs and speeds off around the bend. A few moments later, the priests hear a squeal of tires followed by a splash. The pastor turns to his vicar and says, "Do you think we should change the sign to read, 'Bridge out ahead'?"

There have been so many predictions about the end of the world, the subject has literally become a joke. Pope Sylvester II, Pope Innocent III, Martin Luther, Nostradamus, Sir Isaac Newton, Christopher Columbus, Rasputin, and Pat Robertson are just a few who have made failed predictions. The Jehova's Witnesses have been wrong ten times already. There's been Y2K, the end of the Mayan calendar in 2012, and now we're at the end of John Hagee's tetrad of blood moons while others point to the supposed prophecies of St. Malachy that say that Pope Francis will be the last Pope.

Here's another one: According to some sources, October 13th, 1884 was the date that Pope Leo XIII had a vision after morning Mass where he overheard a conversation between Satan and Jesus. As the story goes, Satan boasted that if given 100 years he could destroy the Church and Jesus told him he would be given the time. In response to this vision, Pope Leo then wrote the original Prayer to St. Michael and added it to the Leonine Prayers. Since 1984 came and went with the Church still intact, the prediction has been revised to say Satan's 100 years didn't start until The Miracle of the Suns in Fatima, which happened on October 13th, 1917. If *they're* to be believed, we only have 2 years until the Second Coming. Or the Great Chastisement. Or the Three Days of Darkness. Or... some other great event of Biblical proportions.

People are always looking for signs of the end times, which makes for entertaining conversation fodder. In Matthew 24, Jesus tells us that God *will* provide signs warning of the last days. If you wake up every day saying "today will be the Second Coming" — assuming you live long enough — some day you'll be right. But isn't it more important to focus on the road you travel every day?

As Jesus tells us in Matthew 24:42-44 "Therefore stay alert, because you do not know on what day your Lord will come. But understand this: If the owner of the house had known at what time of night the thief was coming, he would have been alert and would not have let his house be broken into. Therefore you also must be ready, because the Son of Man will come at an hour when you do not expect him."

Do not fear the end times. Instead, concentrate on the road you're on right now. Pray for the Church and those who serve it. And also pray to be observant, so that you may clearly see the "bridge out" signs that God provides us in our everyday lives, warning us of when we're on the wrong road and need to turn around. So whether it's the end of days, or just the end of *your* days, prepare your soul today for whatever might come tomorrow.
